- Free screenings for breast cancer and cervical cancer from 2024

Report on 2023 National Elections in Argentina

The SIW is gravely concerned over the election of Javier Milei who won the second round of the presidential elections in Argentina on 19th November with 55.7% of the vote.

Milei's victory poses a significant threat to the rights and equality of all Argentinian women and girls. His denial of gender-based violence, despite a femicide in Argentina every 39 hours, and of the gender pay gap in a country where women earn 27% less than men, is unacceptable. It is also deeply worrying that he is expected to launch а referendum designed to repeal the recent legalisation of abortion and to close the Ministry of Women, Gender and Diversity, set up in 2019 to oversee public policy on gender issues.

SIW The stands with its Argentinian members. the Radical Civic Union (UCR). Together, we will not cease in our efforts to protect the rights of women and girls in Argentina. [The Juntos por el Cambio alliance, of which UCR is a member, has won 31 seats in the Chamber of Deputies and two in the senate.]

### Report on 2023 National Elections in Colombia



The SIW is proud to stand in solidarity with its member, the Liberal Party of Colombia, PLC, which received more than two and a half million votes in the local and regional elections, held on October 29th. The party won 200 mayoralties, seven governorships, nine cogovernorships and the largest number of councillors in the country.

We congratulate the PLC and support their tireless campaign to ensure democracy, rights and freedoms for women and girls in Colombia.

Wider results, however, have shown a worrying rise to the right and centre. The success of the 2022 presidential election brought great hope for gender equality, welcoming an unprecedented number of women voted into office.

The SIW will continue to work with the PLC and all those supporting gender equality and women's rights in Colombia in the challenging times ahead.

### Report on 2023 National Elections in Spain



A Spanish general election was held on July 23rd, after regional elections in May resulted in the dissolution of parliament.

Whilst the election results left no overall winner, the wide support for SIW's member party, the Spanish Socialist Workers' Party, PSOE, has not ceased and Pedro Sanchez was re-elected as Prime Minister of the Government of Spain 16 November 2023.

The SIW is proud that PSOE can now continue its path ensuring good governance and socialist policies.

Since 2018, Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez has stood for gender parity and women's rights. His Cabinet over the held vears has а high representation of women and the highest number of female ministers in the country's history. The 2023 Equal Representation Law promotes gender parity in politics. business and public life. It is clear that Sanchez is committed to ensuring that women have an equal voice in policy decision making.

### Report on 2023 National Elections in Turkey



Recep Tayyip Erdoğan's victory in the second round of the presidential election, held on May 28th, marked yet another term for his Justice and Development Party, a distressing defeat for women's progress.

The unjust imprisonment of Ekrem İmamoğlu, Istanbul's mayor and CHP candidate, the arrest of 126 Kurdish lawyers, activists and politicians earlier in the year, and a wider media crackdown, deeply undermined the election.

Erdoğan's People's Alliance, which has called for gender segregation in schools and the elimination of Law 6284 that aims to prevent violence against women, amongst other misogynist policies, retained a majority in parliament.

Femicide is rising in Turkey, and the SIW remains deeply concerned over the ongoing opposition to gender equality and women's rights. The SIW stands with its members, the People's Republican Party, CHP, and the Peoples' Equality and Democracy Party, HEDEP, and will continue its efforts to work together to combat and eradicate policies that are prejudicial to women.

Africa – How Women Grow & Stabilize Economies in Africa (Available in English, French and Spanish)


<u>Report by Anzetse Were, Senior</u> <u>Economist at Financial Sector</u> <u>Deepening (FSD), Kenya</u>

Unpaid care work denies women economic rewards for their time, effort and skills, while compromising their career and business trajectories. In Africa, women spend 3.4 more time in unpaid care work than men and women work more hours than men when unpaid care work and paid work are added together. Further, due to high fertility rates combined with women's high labour force participation rates, 85% of women in Africa are employed and have care responsibilities. **SIW's View**: This is an absolute vital report to read. It highlights the injustice and impact unpaid care work has on women and girls in Africa. But there is hope. The report gives a series of realistic recommendations which if implemented, can transform not only the lives of women but that of their countries too. Read the full report.
